This would include the pathophysiologic and clinical hypotheses formulated by medical and osteopathic physicians as well as chiropractors. Why the relatively sudden interest of the Senate Subcommittee in chiropractic? There were probably many reasons for that interest, but suffice to say anticipation of discussion on the role of chiropractic in any national system of health insurance could in itself have provided adequate stimulus for the request. In any case, the NINCDS was asked to review what was and what was not known about the fundamentals of chiropractic. I stress "fundamentals" since as a research organization, the NINCDS is not charged with reviewing matters such as clinical education, licensure or clinical practice. A small expert committee of scientific consultants helped the Institute design the format and agenda for the Workshop.
